

Scholarships & Financial Aid:

"How can I afford to study abroad? What are the options?"

These are the questions we hear students ask, and so we have done our best to try and make as many possibilities as possible.

Below in this document, we will outline some of the initiatives we have taken to try and make studying abroad more affordable.

But first... why not *also* look at what other options are out there? To help you with this research, we have created a handy guide to external scholarships.



1.) Our most popular scholarships:

Internship (for scholarships)

- Gain professional experience working with Summit Global Education in exchange for tuition reduction scholarships to study abroad on Summit programs.

2.) Campus Ambassador scholarships

- Are you willing to help Summit Global Education to build meaningful relations with your university? Then, this might be the right scholarship for you!
- If your university is not currently familiarized with Summit Global Education, we ask for your help in building that bridge by starting a dialogue with the office of Study Abroad as well as with the various relevant departments and schools (School of Business, International Studies, Political Science, School of Communication, etc.)
- \$100 discount: Be the first student from your university
 to get their course approved for credit transfer. To
 qualify for this scholarship, you must document your
 activities in an email summary, and get approval in
 writing from Summit prior to studying abroad.
- \$500 discount: Be the student who introduces Summit
 Global Education to your study abroad office, and if they
 put our programs on their website as an affiliated (or
 recommended) program option, you will receive an
 additional \$500 discount off of any Summit program. In
 addition, all students from your university will receive this
 benefit in the future. See note below. To qualify for this
 scholarship, you must document your activities in an
 email summary, and get approval in writing from Summit
 prior to studying abroad.

3.) Needs-based scholarships

Use your EXISTING FINANCIAL AID to study abroad:

- You should be able to use your existing financial aid to study abroad! Do do so, there might be some forms that your university will ask Summit to sign and return.

PELL Grant Matching Scholarships

 These are need-based matching grants (up to \$300 per applicant) that are designed to offset the increased cost of studying on a Summit Global Education program relative to one's home campus. To be eligible students must demonstrate that they are PELL grant recipients and that the Summit program is more expensive than studying on their home campus. These scholarships are awarded on a case-by-case basis and priority will be given to students who apply early.







3.) Needs-based scholarships (continued)

 The Federal Pell Grant Program is designed to provide need-based grants to low-income undergraduate students in order to promote improved access to postsecondary education. Summit Global Education's mission is to make its study abroad programs more affordable for a diverse group of students, to include low-income undergraduates which might not otherwise afford international opportunities. Our hope is that this Pell Grant Matching Scholarship will allow us to make our study abroad programs within greater reach financially to a wide range of students.

Loss of Aid Scholarships

 For students who lose merit-based financial aid in order to study abroad, Summit Global Education may replace some of that lost aid (up to a maximum of \$300 per applicant). These scholarships are also awarded on a case-by-case basis and priority will be given to students who apply early. Contact Summit for more details

4.) Affiliated university scholarships

- Does your university list the Summit Study Abroad programs on their website?
- Go to your university's study abroad website and take a look. Do you see an area for external providers?
 (Depending on your school, this might be called "3rd party providers", or "affiliate programs")
- If Summit is listed on your university's website as an affiliated (or recommended) program option, then all students from your university will receive a \$500 scholarship when they participate in a Summit Study Abroad program

6.) More options:

Early Application Discount:

• To qualify, pay \$500 confirmation deposit by the deadline

Delay payment for 6 months

 Through PayPal, students can elect to delay their payments for up to 6 months (with no interest). By selecting this option, Summit will be paid now, but students do not need to pay PayPal for up to 6 months.

Honor roll, merit-based Scholarships:

 \$200 value. Merit-based Scholarship to Study Abroad with Summit Global Education. GPA minimum of 3.8.

Where to start your search:

Scholarships come from a variety of sources: schools, employers, individuals, private companies, nonprofits, religious groups, or professional organizations. These sources offer scholarships for a variety of reasons. Some are offered to students that have financial need. Some scholarships have academic requirements like a certain GPA or enrollment in a particular major. There are athletic, music, and art scholarships. There are scholarships for minorities and first-generation students; and some for students with certain community affiliations or religious affiliations.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's)

On this page we will outline some of the most frequent questions that students have asked:

Application Questions:

Early application Discount:

- How do I qualify for the "early application discount" for the upcoming Summer program in Europe?
- ANSWER: Confirm your attendance by December 18th, 2015
- First step: apply to an upcoming program.
- Second step: pay the \$40 application fee.
- · Third step: Fill out necessary essays, and get approved by Summit.
- Fourth (and final) step: Confirm your attendance by paying the \$500 confirmation deposit payment (here).
 Note: If your \$500 confirmation deposit is received before the cutoff date (for the early application discount), you will qualify for the lower prices.

What are the Admission Requirements?:

- All majors welcome!
- · 18 years old at the start of our program
- · Completed at least one semester of university
- Enrolled in university (or recently graduated). Both Undergraduate and Graduate students are welcome to apply.
- 2.2 Grade Point Average (GPA) 77/100 for international students.
- Students with a lower GPA should submit an additional letter of reference, preferably from a professor, along
 with a brief letter explaining the circumstances of the lower GPA.

Will the credits transfer?

Yes, they should. Our partner universities in Europe and in Brazil are some of the best. Please see the our
guide to credit transfer and let us know if you have any questions.

How many students are expected to participate?

Each session has a maximum of international 28 students. Last summer we had 22 students from a mix of
universities across the USA and from around the world.

Has any student from my university attended before?

See the list of students who have attended previous Summit Study Abroad programs. We are proud to say that
our alumni have come from some of the finest universities from around the world!

How selective is the admissions process?

• Since we are a small group (and we all travel together), it is extremely important that we get the "right" students in our program. Is this based on GPA? No! Absolutely not! The student with a perfect 4.0 GPA might be the absolutely wrong candidate for our program (as might the student with a 3.2)! They might not be the right fit for our group, and the unique traveling nature of our programs. So how do we decide? The old-fashioned way: by personally interviewing each candidate and personally evaluating their "fit" (based on interests, openness to new cultures, a willingness to learn and try new things, etc). By the time a student comes abroad with us, they will likely have personally talked with our director, a professor, some of our students, an alumni, an intern, etc.

Application Fee: If I change my mind to do a different program, do I pay the \$40 application fee again?

- No, you do not.
- The \$40 application fee is a one-time fee.
- . If you decide to change to a shorter or longer program, the original \$40 application fee covers it.



Course Questions:

How many courses can I take?

- . Depending on which session you choose, you can take up to 2 courses (for 6 credits)
- Please visit our courses page to review the options, and let us know if you have any questions.

Can I get help with credit-transfer to my university?

- Yes! We are here to help!
- First step: visit our credit-transfer page on our website and follow the step-by-step instructions.
- Then, put us in contact with your adviser (or professor), we would be happy to talk with them to see if our courses are the right fit for you!

Do I need to learn any languages before going abroad?

- No. The only requirement is that you need to be fluent in English (since all of our courses are conducted in English).
- But, we highly recommend that each student should work on at least <u>one language</u> before coming abroad. For
 example, if you are going to spend 2+ weeks in Barcelona, it might be nice to know a few words in Spanish! If
 you are coming to Paris, we highly recommend learning a little French! For this, we highly recommend all
 students to download this app to their cell phones (its free and easy!): https://www.duolingo.com/
- In addition, for each country we visit, Summit will help by recommending some simple gestures and etiquette
 vocabulary to get an understanding of the culture.

Program Questions:

How does the Summit Study Abroad program work?:

We have a Summit base camp in Barcelona and another in Prague, where students spend about two and a half
weeks in each location, taking courses on campus while living in apartments or student housing. In between
we travel, giving students a chance to see more of Europe, and to take classes with some of the best
professors at great universities in cities like Paris, London and Budapest.

Which Program/ Session should I take?

- First decide how long do you want to be abroad? And, which cities do you want to visit? Then, see our Dates and Sessions
- Then decide how many classes do you want to take abroad? If you want to take 2 courses, then take an option
 that allows you to do so. Ask us if you have any questions.
- If you are taking just one course, then decide between our "Global Summit Barcelona" and our "Global Summit
 Prague" programs. Different courses are available in different sessions, so choose carefully!

After the program is done, are we allowed to stay longer on our own time?

- Yes you are.
- Many students choose to explore Europe on their own (or with family and friends) before and after the
 program. While this is not officially part of the Summit program, we would be more-than-happy to help you
 choosing places to visit, and with tips about how to get there on your own.

On our free weekends, are we able to travel to a different city / country for a day or two?

- Yes, students are allowed (and encouraged) to take full-advantage of the free weekends.
- On the free weekends, we will recommend a ton of fun activities in the city we are visiting. This might include
 recommended local tours, hikes, museums and more. But you are also welcome to travel to other nearby cities
 (and beaches, mountains, etc), and we will help you with the planning if you like! The only requirement is that
 you tell us where you are going (so we can contact you if your parents are looking for you), and that you return
 in time for class and activities on Monday morning!



If we want to do extracurricular activities, are we allowed?

- · Yes, absolutely! We will help you with this by recommending a ton of fun activities in each city we visit (options include hiking, biking, yoga, beach volleyball, gym memberships, specialized tours, excursions, and more!)
- · We highly encourage students to try new things while traveling!

Will we have free time (outside of class and organized activities)?

- Yes! Our programs are designed so students have time to experience the cities outside of class time.
- . This is especially true for students taking just one course (on any of our longer sessions)

Do we have a curfew to return to the apartments during the weekdays?

. No, there is no curfew. Within our program, the students have to be at least 18 years old (most are 20+), and as adults they are free to come back at any time. We highly recommend not staying out too late, especially when classes are during the weekday.
